Akron Snow Angels' Volunteers Make a Difference This Holiday Season

The Akron Snow Angels continue to persevere in their mission with the help of much needed volunteers despite challenges of COVID-19 Environment.

AKRON, Ohio – Dec. 8, 2021 – The 2021-2022 Akron Snow Angels weekend missions are expected to continue through the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, and new safety policies have been implemented for everyone's protection. This year's season will run from Nov. 2021- April 2022 and bringing in new volunteers in to spread warmth to those who need is essential this year.

"The Akron Snow Angels is all about spreading warmth in multiple different ways to our community especially during the pandemic," Akron Snow Angels founder, Erin Victor, said. "Not only is it our mission to help people stay warm physically throughout the winter by providing them with resources, but also to foster warmth in the hearts of all involved through human connection and the building of relationships."

COVID-19 won't stop Akron Snow Angels from spreading the warmth by giving back and building relationships, and the organizations welcomes people who share the same values to join as volunteers. Volunteering with the Akron Snow Angels can be an opportunity for corporate groups, church groups, families, or individuals.

There are two ways Akron Snow Angel volunteers can participate this mission season. Volunteers can either do sorting and tagging during weekdays or they could be mission drivers and riders on the weekends. Sorting and tagging consists of the organizing items like clothing to help prepare the inventory for the weekend missions. Mission drivers and riders will assist with the distribution of resources to those in need and will need own vehicle, clean trunk, driver's license and insurance.

This year the Akron Snow Angels are in most need of sorting and tagging volunteers to work in the warehouse on weekdays due to the volume of donations especially during the week of Christmas and the week after. This job is essential to carrying out the Akron Snow Angels mission by preparing the items for the weekend mission deliveries.

Akron Snow Angels will not require volunteers to share their vaccination status. However, if a volunteer wishes to share that they are vaccinated then they can be matched to volunteer with more vulnerable populations.

Volunteers are asked to do self-health checks before every shift and if they have any symptoms should not report for their shift. Additionally, volunteers are asked to wear masks for their entire shifts regardless of being indoors or outdoors.
